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Saying 1

Jesus said, "Whoever finds the interpretation of these sayings will not experience death."

Interpretation:

Unlocking the true meaning behind spiritual teachings leads to deep transformation—awakening to your higher self, beyond the fear of death or limitation. When you “interpret” these truths for yourself, you transcend ordinary existence and live consciously.

Saying 2

Jesus said, "Let him who seeks continue seeking until he finds. When he finds, he will become troubled. When he becomes troubled, he will be astonished, and he will rule over the All."

Interpretation

The journey of awakening starts with seeking. True seekers may feel uncomfortable as old beliefs are challenged, but this “trouble” leads to breakthrough and realization—an inner power to shape your life and reality (“rule over the All”).

Saying 3

Jesus said, "If those who lead you say to you, 'See, the kingdom is in the sky,' then the birds of the sky will precede you. If they say to you, 'It is in the sea,' then the fish will precede you. Rather, the kingdom is inside of you, and it is outside of you. When you come to know yourselves, then you will become known, and you will realize that it is you who are the sons of the living father. But if you will not know yourselves, you dwell in poverty and it is you who are that poverty."

Interpretation

Don't look outside yourself for power or truth—the "kingdom" (your ability to create reality) is within you. Knowing yourself and your own mind unlocks true abundance and creative potential; ignoring your inner world leads to lack and limitation.

Saying 4

Jesus said, "The man old in days will not hesitate to ask a small child seven days old about the place of life, and he will live. For many who are first will become last, and they will become one and the same."

Interpretation:

Stay humble and open-minded—wisdom can come from anywhere, even unexpected sources. A beginner's mind (like a child) is powerful for manifestation, as it's free from the limits of "how things should be."

Saying 5

Jesus said, "Recognize what is in your sight, and that which is hidden from you will become plain to you. For there is nothing hidden which will not become manifest."

Interpretation:

Awareness is key: When you fully recognize the present moment and your current reality, hidden truths and opportunities reveal themselves. What you focus on will eventually become visible in your life—manifested from the unseen.

Saying 6

His disciples questioned him and said to him, "Do you want us to fast? How shall we pray? Shall we give alms? What diet shall we observe?" Jesus said, "Do not tell lies, and do not do what you hate, for all things are plain in the sight of heaven. For nothing hidden will not become manifest, and nothing covered will remain without being uncovered."

Interpretation::

External rituals matter less than being true to yourself. Live authentically, align actions with your values, and your inner world will reflect in your outer world. Whatever you suppress or hide within will eventually manifest in your reality.

Saying 7

Jesus said, "Blessed is the lion which becomes man when consumed by man; and cursed is the man whom the lion consumes, and the lion becomes man."

Interpretation:

Your inner "beast" (fears, instincts, subconscious drives) can either rule you or be transformed by your conscious mind. When you master your inner forces, you rise above them; when you are ruled by them, you become lost in lower energies.

Saying 8

And he said, "The man is like a wise fisherman who cast his net into the sea and drew it up from the sea full of small fish. Among them the wise fisherman found a fine large fish. He threw all the small fish back into the sea and chose the large fish without difficulty. Whoever has ears to hear, let him hear."

Interpretation:

Not every opportunity or thought is worth pursuing. Focus your energy on what truly matters to you—your “big fish”—and don’t be distracted by small, insignificant things. Selectivity and clarity are powerful for manifesting your best reality.

Saying 9

Jesus said, "Now the sower went out, took a handful (of seeds), and scattered them. Some fell on the road; the birds came and gathered them up. Others fell on the rock, did not take root in the soil, and did not produce ears. And others fell on thorns; they choked the seed(s) and worms ate them. And others fell on the good soil and it produced good fruit: it bore sixty per measure and a hundred and twenty per measure."

Interpretation:

Your intentions are seeds. Some will not flourish if your environment or mindset isn’t right. Cultivate the “good soil” of positive beliefs, supportive habits, and clear vision—this is where your dreams grow and multiply.

Saying 10

Jesus said, "I have cast fire upon the world, and see, I am guarding it until it blazes."

Interpretation:

Spiritual awakening is a spark—once ignited, it can transform everything. Protect your inner fire (motivation, inspiration) until it's strong enough to transform your life and inspire others.

Saying 11

Jesus said, "This heaven will pass away, and the one above it will pass away. The dead are not alive, and the living will not die. In the days when you consumed what is dead, you made it what is alive. When you come to dwell in the light, what will you do? On the day when you were one you became two. But when you become two, what will you do?"

Interpretation:

Reality is always changing; clinging to the past keeps you spiritually "dead." True living is awakening to your power, uniting the divided parts of yourself, and choosing light (conscious creation) over darkness (unconscious living).

Saying 12

The disciples said to Jesus, "We know that you will depart from us. Who is to be our leader?" Jesus said to them, "Wherever you are, you are to go to James the righteous, for whose sake heaven and earth came into being."

Interpretation:

Don't look for authority outside yourself. The true guide is within—the "righteous" part of you that knows truth. Trust your inner wisdom as you manifest your own path.

Saying 13

Jesus said to his disciples, "Compare me to someone and tell me whom I am like." Simon Peter said to him, "You are like a righteous angel." Matthew said to him, "You are like a wise philosopher." Thomas said to him, "Master, my mouth is wholly incapable of saying whom you are like." Jesus said, "I am not your master. Because you have drunk, you have become intoxicated from the bubbling spring which I have measured out." And he took him and withdrew and told him three things. When Thomas returned to his companions, they asked him, "What did Jesus say to you?" Thomas said to them, "If I tell you one of the things which he told me, you will pick up stones and throw them at me; a fire will come out of the stones and burn you up."

Interpretation:

Truth cannot always be explained logically; some spiritual realizations must be experienced, not just spoken. When you awaken to inner knowing, you are transformed beyond labels and conventional understanding.

Saying 14

Jesus said to them, "If you fast, you will give rise to sin for yourselves; and if you pray, you will be condemned; and if you give alms, you will do harm to your spirits. When you go into any land and walk about in the districts, if they receive you, eat what they will set before you, and heal the sick among them. For what goes into your mouth will not defile you, but that which issues from your mouth - it is that which will defile you."

Interpretation:

It's not about rituals or outer acts, but your words and thoughts. What you speak and believe creates your reality. Focus on aligning your speech and actions with your true intentions, rather than worrying about appearances.

Saying 15

Jesus said, "When you see one who was not born of woman, prostrate yourselves on your faces and worship him. That one is your father."

Interpretation:

There is a higher, divine consciousness within all of us—unborn, unlimited, and eternal. Honor this higher self within you; it is the true source of your creative power.

Saying 16

Jesus said, "Men think, perhaps, that it is peace which I have come to cast upon the world. They do not know that it is dissension which I have come to cast upon the earth: fire, sword, and war. For there will be five in a house: three will be against two, and two against three, the father against the son, and the son against the father. And they will stand solitary."

Interpretation:

Spiritual awakening often stirs up inner and outer conflict. Growth shakes up old beliefs, leading to tension both within yourself and with others. Real transformation may require breaking away from conformity to stand in your own truth, even if it means feeling alone.

Saying 17

Jesus said, "I shall give you what no eye has seen and what no ear has heard and what no hand has touched and what has never occurred to the human mind."

Interpretation:

True spiritual realization brings experiences and insights that go beyond the senses and ordinary thought. By raising your consciousness, you open yourself to possibilities and wisdom previously unimaginable.

Saying 18

The disciples said to Jesus, "Tell us how our end will be." Jesus said, "Have you discovered, then, the beginning, that you look for the end? For where the beginning is, there will the end be. Blessed is he who will take his place in the beginning; he will know the end and will not experience death."

Interpretation:

Seek to understand your origins—your true self and spiritual source—rather than obsessing over the outcome or the “end.” When you connect to your original essence, you transcend the cycle of fear and limitation.

Saying 19

Jesus said, "Blessed is he who came into being before he came into being. If you become my disciples and listen to my words, these stones will minister to you. For there are five trees for you in Paradise which remain undisturbed summer and winter and whose leaves do not fall. Whoever becomes acquainted with them will not experience death."

Interpretation:

Awakening means realizing your soul existed before your current identity. When you connect to this timeless aspect of yourself, life reveals its mysteries to you and you find lasting peace that does not fade with time.

Saying 20

The disciples said to Jesus, "Tell us what the kingdom of heaven is like." He said to them, "It is like a mustard seed. It is the smallest of all seeds. But when it falls on tilled soil, it produces a great plant and becomes a shelter for birds of the sky."

Interpretation:

Big transformations start from small beginnings. Nurture the “seed” of spiritual awareness within yourself, and it will grow into something powerful—providing shelter, support, and meaning far beyond what you first imagined.

Saying 21

Mary said to Jesus, "Whom are your disciples like?" He said, "They are like children who have settled in a field which is not theirs. When the owners of the field come, they will say, 'Let us have back our field.' They (will) undress in their presence in order to let them have back their field and to give it back to them. Therefore I say, if the owner of a house knows that the thief is coming, he will begin his vigil before he comes and will not let him dig through into his house of his domain to carry away his goods. You, then, be on your guard against the world. Arm yourselves with great strength lest the robbers find a way to come to you, for the difficulty which you expect will (surely) materialize. Let there be among you a man of understanding. When the grain ripened, he came quickly with his sickle in his hand and reaped it. Whoever has ears to hear, let him hear."

Interpretation:

Remain alert and self-aware. In the world, your soul can become distracted or “robbed” by illusions and challenges. Protect your energy and wisdom, and when the right moment comes, act decisively to reap the rewards of your awareness.

Saying 22

Jesus saw infants being suckled. He said to his disciples, "These infants being suckled are like those who enter the kingdom." They said to him, "Shall we then, as children, enter the kingdom?" Jesus said to them, "When you make the two one, and when you make the inside like the outside and the outside like the inside, and the above like the below, and when you make the male and the female one and the same, so that the male not be male nor the female; and when you fashion eyes in the place of an eye, and a hand in place of a hand, and a foot in place of a foot, and a likeness in place of a likeness; then will you enter the kingdom."

Interpretation:

True spiritual power comes from unity—balancing dualities within yourself (masculine/feminine, inner/outer, above/below). When you return to childlike wholeness and see the world without division, you access higher consciousness.

Saying 23

Jesus said, "I shall choose you, one out of a thousand, and two out of ten thousand, and they shall stand as a single one."

Interpretation:

The spiritual path is for those truly seeking unity and truth, not the masses. When you awaken, you become part of a rare group of conscious souls—standing in your true power and oneness.

Saying 24

His disciples said to him, "Show us the place where you are, since it is necessary for us to seek it."

He said to them, "Whoever has ears, let him hear. There is light within a man of light, and he lights up the whole world. If he does not shine, he is darkness."

Interpretation:

The light you seek is already within you. As you awaken and express your inner light, you positively affect the world. If you ignore your own light, you remain in darkness—your reality reflects your inner state.

Saying 25

Jesus said, "Love your brother like your soul, guard him like the pupil of your eye."

Interpretation:

See others as extensions of yourself. When you practice true love and compassion, you not only uplift others, but also protect and nurture your own soul's growth.

Saying 26

Jesus said, "You see the mote in your brother's eye, but you do not see the beam in your own eye.

When you cast the beam out of your own eye, then you will see clearly to cast the mote from your brother's eye."

Interpretation:

Self-awareness comes first. Before judging or trying to change others, work on your own blind spots. When you clear your own limiting beliefs and patterns, you can truly help and understand those around you.

Saying 27

Jesus said, "If you do not fast as regards the world, you will not find the kingdom. If you do not observe the Sabbath as a Sabbath, you will not see the father."

Interpretation:

Detach from worldly distractions to access higher states of consciousness. Take regular time to rest, reflect, and connect within. Spiritual clarity is found in stillness and conscious withdrawal from daily noise.

Saying 28

Jesus said, "I took my place in the midst of the world, and I appeared to them in flesh. I found all of them intoxicated; I found none of them thirsty. And my soul became afflicted for the sons of men, because they are blind in their hearts and do not have sight; for empty they came into the world, and empty too they seek to leave the world. But for the moment they are intoxicated. When they shake off their wine, then they will repent."

Interpretation:

Many people are distracted or numbed by the material world and miss the deeper meaning of life. Spiritual awakening happens when you "wake up" from unconscious habits and seek something greater—your true purpose.

Saying 29

Jesus said, "If the flesh came into being because of spirit, it is a wonder. But if spirit came into being because of the body, it is a wonder of wonders. Indeed, I am amazed at how this great wealth has made its home in this poverty."

Interpretation:

Your true self (spirit) is unlimited and abundant, temporarily experiencing life in a limited physical body. Recognizing this paradox awakens gratitude and awe for the miracle of existence.

Saying 30

Jesus said, "Where there are three gods, they are gods. Where there are two or one, I am with him."

Interpretation:

When you realize the unity of all things—when there's no separation—you tap into divine presence. Oneness with the Source is the foundation of true spiritual power.

Saying 31

Jesus said, "No prophet is accepted in his own village; no physician heals those who know him."

Interpretation:

People close to you may not recognize your growth or gifts, because they see only your past. Trust your journey and don't be discouraged by doubt or resistance from those around you.

Saying 32

Jesus said, "A city being built on a high mountain and fortified cannot fall, nor can it be hidden."

Interpretation:

When you build your life on strong spiritual foundations, you become unshakeable. Your inner light and strength will naturally be seen and felt by others.

Saying 33

Jesus said, "Preach from your housetops that which you will hear in your ear. For no one lights a lamp and puts it under a bushel, nor does he put it in a hidden place, but rather he sets it on a lamp stand so that everyone who enters and leaves will see its light."

Interpretation:

Share your insights and truth openly. Don't hide your gifts or wisdom—let your light shine, as it will inspire and help others to do the same.

Saying 34

Jesus said, "If a blind man leads a blind man, they will both fall into a pit."

Interpretation:

Follow those who have true spiritual vision and awareness. Don't let yourself be led by ignorance or unconsciousness—seek your own clarity and discernment.

Saying 35

Jesus said, "It is not possible for anyone to enter the house of a strong man and take it by force unless he binds his hands; then he will (be able to) ransack his house."

Interpretation:

Guard your mind and spirit from influences that weaken you. Only when you surrender your inner power can negativity or self-doubt take hold. Stay conscious and empowered in your own "house."

Saying 36

Jesus said, "Do not be concerned from morning until evening and from evening until morning about what you will wear."

Interpretation:

Release anxiety about material concerns. Trust that your needs will be met when you focus on your spiritual growth and inner well-being. Worry blocks your creative energy; faith opens the flow.

Saying 37

His disciples said, "When will you become revealed to us and when shall we see you?" Jesus said, "When you disrobe without being ashamed and take up your garments and place them under your feet like little children and tread on them, then will you see the son of the living one, and you will not be afraid."

Interpretation:

True realization comes when you let go of your masks, ego, and shame. Embrace your authentic self with innocence and courage, and you'll experience spiritual freedom and clarity.

Saying 38

Jesus said, "Many times have you desired to hear these words which I am saying to you, and you have no one else to hear them from. There will be days when you will look for me and will not find me."

Interpretation:

Value true wisdom when it comes to you—don't take spiritual insight for granted. Stay present and open, as moments of deep realization are precious and may not always be available.

Saying 39

Jesus said, "The pharisees and the scribes have taken the keys of knowledge (gnosis) and hidden them. They themselves have not entered, nor have they allowed to enter those who wish to. You, however, be as wise as serpents and as innocent as doves."

Interpretation:

Don't let external authorities or tradition block your direct access to truth. Be clever and discerning, yet keep your heart pure—seek knowledge for yourself, and don't rely on gatekeepers.

Saying 40

Jesus said, "A grapevine has been planted outside of the father, but being unsound, it will be pulled up by its roots and destroyed."

Interpretation:

Anything built on false foundations or disconnected from your true self will not last. Align your actions and creations with your higher purpose so they stand strong and endure.

Saying 41

Jesus said, "Whoever has something in his hand will receive more, and whoever has nothing will be deprived of even the little he has."

Interpretation:

Abundance grows where there is gratitude and awareness of what you already have. Focus on your strengths and blessings—what you appreciate expands in your reality.

Saying 42

Jesus said, "Become passers-by."

Interpretation:

Don't become attached to the world or its dramas. Stay present but detached, moving through life as a conscious observer. This frees you from suffering and opens the path to higher awareness.

Saying 43

His disciples said to him, "Who are you, that you should say these things to us?" Jesus said to them, "You do not realize who I am from what I say to you, but you have become like the Jews, for they (either) love the tree and hate its fruit (or) love the fruit and hate the tree."

Interpretation:

True wisdom isn't about external identities or appearances, but about recognizing essence. Don't get caught up in judging by labels or surface details; seek the deeper connection between cause and effect, root and fruit.

Saying 44

Jesus said, "Whoever blasphemes against the father will be forgiven, and whoever blasphemes against the son will be forgiven, but whoever blasphemes against the holy spirit will not be forgiven either on earth or in heaven."

Interpretation:

To reject your own inner spirit—your divine essence—is to block yourself from spiritual growth. Outer mistakes can be healed, but turning away from your true self leaves you lost and disconnected.

Saying 45

Jesus said, "Grapes are not harvested from thorns, nor are figs gathered from thistles, for they do not produce fruit. A good man brings forth good from his storehouse; an evil man brings forth evil things from his evil storehouse, which is in his heart, and says evil things. For out of the abundance of the heart he brings forth evil things."

Interpretation:

Your reality is shaped by what is in your heart and mind. Nurture positivity, kindness, and purpose within, and you will naturally manifest good in your life and in the world around you.

Saying 46

Jesus said, "Among those born of women, from Adam until John the Baptist, there is no one so superior to John the Baptist that his eyes should not be lowered (before him). Yet I have said, whichever one of you comes to be a child will be acquainted with the kingdom and will become superior to John."

Interpretation:

Even the greatest teachers are surpassed by those who reclaim the innocence and openness of a child. Letting go of ego and embracing childlike curiosity opens the door to true spiritual mastery.

Saying 47

Jesus said, "It is impossible for a man to mount two horses or to stretch two bows. And it is impossible for a servant to serve two masters; otherwise, he will honor the one and treat the other contemptuously. No man drinks old wine and immediately desires to drink new wine. And new wine is not put into old wineskins, lest they burst; nor is old wine put into a new wineskin, lest it spoil it. An old patch is not sewn onto a new garment, because a tear would result."

Interpretation:

You can't serve two conflicting purposes or hold onto the old while fully embracing the new. For transformation, release old patterns and commit to your new direction with clarity and focus.

Saying 48

Jesus said, "If two make peace with each other in this one house, they will say to the mountain, 'Move Away,' and it will move away."

Interpretation:

Inner harmony unlocks extraordinary power. When your thoughts and emotions are united and at peace, you gain the ability to move obstacles and create profound change in your life.

Saying 49

Jesus said, "Blessed are the solitary and elect, for you will find the kingdom. For you are from it, and to it you will return."

Interpretation:

Solitude and self-reflection lead to deep spiritual discovery. Your true home is the inner kingdom—the source you came from and to which you return through self-awareness.

Saying 50

Jesus said, "If they say to you, 'Where did you come from?', say to them, 'We came from the light, the place where the light came into being on its own accord and established itself and became manifest through their image.' If they say to you, 'Is it you?', say, 'We are its children, we are the elect of the living father.' If they ask you, 'What is the sign of your father in you?', say to them, 'It is movement and repose.'"

Interpretation:

Your origin is divine light—pure consciousness. The sign of spiritual awakening is the dance between action (movement) and stillness (repose); balance these within, and you express your true nature.

Saying 51

His disciples said to him, "When will the repose of the dead come about, and when will the new world come?" He said to them, "What you look forward to has already come, but you do not recognize it."

Interpretation:

The spiritual reality you seek is already present—awakening is a shift in perception, not something to be found in the future. Recognize the kingdom now, and you'll experience true peace.

Saying 52

His disciples said to him, "Twenty-four prophets spoke in Israel, and all of them spoke in you." He said to them, "You have omitted the one living in your presence and have spoken (only) of the dead."

Interpretation:

Don't just honor the wisdom of the past; recognize the living presence of truth within you, here and now. Your own direct experience is as valuable as ancient teachings.

Saying 53

His disciples said to him, "Is circumcision beneficial or not?" He said to them, "If it were beneficial, their father would beget them already circumcised from their mother. Rather, the true circumcision in spirit has become completely profitable."

Interpretation:

Spiritual transformation is an inner process, not a physical or external ritual. Focus on inner change—purifying your mind and heart—over outward displays of faith.

Saying 54

Jesus said, "Blessed are the poor, for yours is the kingdom of heaven."

Interpretation:

Those unattached to material wealth are free to discover spiritual riches. When you let go of the need for external possessions, you make space for true abundance and inner fulfillment.

Saying 55

Jesus said, "Whoever does not hate his father and his mother cannot become a disciple to me. And whoever does not hate his brothers and sisters and take up his cross in my way will not be worthy of me."

Interpretation:

True awakening requires breaking free from limiting loyalties, beliefs, and identities—even those inherited from family or society. Follow your unique spiritual path, even if it means standing apart from old attachments.

Saying 56

Jesus said, "Whoever has come to understand the world has found (only) a corpse, and whoever has found a corpse is superior to the world."

Interpretation:

When you see through the illusions and distractions of the material world, you recognize its emptiness. Real wisdom is realizing that spiritual truth goes beyond surface appearances—then, you are no longer ruled by the world.

Saying 57

Jesus said, "The kingdom of the father is like a man who had good seed. His enemy came by night and sowed weeds among the good seed. The man did not allow them to pull up the weeds; he said to them, 'I am afraid that you will go intending to pull up the weeds and pull up the wheat along with them.' For on the day of the harvest the weeds will be plainly visible, and they will be pulled up and burned."

Interpretation:

In your life, both positive intentions and negative influences can grow together. Don't worry about eradicating every flaw immediately—when the time is right, truth will become clear and what doesn't serve you will fall away.

Saying 58

Jesus said, "Blessed is the man who has suffered and found life."

Interpretation:

Challenges and suffering can lead to deep transformation. When you use adversity as a doorway to awakening, you discover a richer, more meaningful life.

Saying 59

Jesus said, "Take heed of the living one while you are alive, lest you die and seek to see him and be unable to do so."

Interpretation:

Seek spiritual awareness in this moment—don't put it off. Awakening is for the living; embrace consciousness now rather than waiting until it's too late.

Saying 60

They saw a Samaritan carrying a lamb on his way to Judea. He said to his disciples, "That man is round about the lamb." They said to him, "So that he may kill it and eat it." He said to them, "While it is alive, he will not eat it, but only when he has killed it and it has become a corpse." They said to him, "He cannot do so otherwise." He said to them, "You too, look for a place for yourself within repose, lest you become a corpse and be eaten."

Interpretation:

If you live unconsciously, you become vulnerable to being "consumed" by the world's distractions or negativity. Find inner peace and awareness—this is your protection against losing yourself.

Saying 61

Jesus said, "Two will rest on a bed: the one will die, and the other will live." Salome said, "Who are you, man, that you ... have come up on my couch and eaten from my table?" Jesus said to her, "I am he who exists from the undivided. I was given some of the things of my father." ... "I am your disciple." ... "Therefore I say, if he is destroyed, he will be filled with light, but if he is divided, he will be filled with darkness."

Interpretation:

Wholeness brings enlightenment; division brings confusion. The part of you aligned with spirit is immortal, while attachment to the divided, ego-based self leads to darkness. Seek inner unity for spiritual fulfillment.

Saying 62

Jesus said, "It is to those who are worthy of my mysteries that I tell my mysteries. Do not let your left (hand) know what your right (hand) is doing."

Interpretation:

Spiritual truths are for those truly ready to receive them. Practice humility and discretion—sometimes, your inner growth is best nurtured in silence, without seeking external validation.

Saying 63

Jesus said, "There was a rich man who had much money. He said, 'I shall put my money to use so that I may sow, reap, plant, and fill my storehouse with produce, with the result that I shall lack nothing.' Such were his intentions, but that same night he died. Let him who has ears hear."

Interpretation:

Don't become attached to accumulating material wealth or planning only for the future. Life is uncertain, and spiritual fulfillment is found by living consciously in the present.

Saying 64

Jesus said, "A man had received visitors. And when he had prepared the dinner, he sent his servant to invite the guests. He went to the first one and said to him, 'My master invites you.' He said, 'I have claims against some merchants. They are coming to me this evening. I must go and give them my orders. I ask to be excused from the dinner.' He went to another and said to him, 'My master has invited you.' He said to him, 'I have just bought a house and am required for the day. I shall not have any spare time.' He went to another and said to him, 'My master invites you.' He said to him, 'My friend is going to get married, and I am to prepare the banquet. I shall not be able to come. I ask to be excused from the dinner.' He went to another and said to him, 'My master invites you.' He said to him, 'I have just bought a farm, and I am on my way to collect the rent. I shall not be able to come. I ask to be excused.' The servant returned and said to his master, 'Those whom you invited to the dinner have asked to be excused.' The master said to his servant, 'Go outside to the streets and bring back those whom you happen to meet, so that they may dine.' Businessmen and merchants will not enter the places of my father."

Interpretation:

If you're too focused on worldly responsibilities and distractions, you might miss out on the spiritual banquet available to you. Stay open and ready for higher experiences—don't let busyness or material priorities keep you from true fulfillment.

Saying 65

He said, "There was a good man who owned a vineyard. He leased it to tenant farmers so that they might work it and he might collect the produce from them. He sent his servant so that the tenants might give him the produce of the vineyard. They seized his servant and beat him, all but killing him. The servant went back and told his master. The master said, 'Perhaps he did not recognize them.' He sent another servant. The tenants beat this one as well. Then the owner sent his son and said, 'Perhaps they will show respect to my son.' Because the tenants knew that it was he who was the heir to the vineyard, they seized him and killed him. Let him who has ears hear."

Interpretation:

Ignoring or resisting divine guidance leads to suffering and loss. Be receptive to messages from your higher self and from life itself; rejecting this guidance only distances you from your true potential and abundance.

Saying 66

Jesus said, "Show me the stone which the builders have rejected. That one is the cornerstone."

Interpretation:

What is overlooked or dismissed by others—your unique gifts, forgotten truths, or inner wisdom—often becomes the foundation for your greatest growth. Value what is authentic within you, even if it's unrecognized by the world.

Saying 67

Jesus said, "If one who knows the all still feels a personal deficiency, he is completely deficient."

Interpretation:

Even with knowledge, feeling lack or unworthiness keeps you from fulfillment. True spiritual awakening is realizing your completeness and sufficiency within; lack is only an illusion.

Saying 68

Jesus said, "Blessed are you when you are hated and persecuted. Wherever you have been persecuted they will find no place."

Interpretation:

Being misunderstood or rejected for your truth is a sign you are on the spiritual path. When you remain true to yourself, outside attacks cannot touch your inner peace.

Saying 69

Jesus said, "Blessed are they who have been persecuted within themselves. It is they who have truly come to know the father. Blessed are the hungry, for the belly of him who desires will be filled."

Interpretation:

Inner struggles and spiritual hunger drive you toward awakening. When you honestly face your inner doubts and longings, you open the way to deeper wisdom and fulfillment.

Saying 70

Jesus said, "That which you have will save you if you bring it forth from yourselves. That which you do not have within you will kill you if you do not have it within you."

Interpretation:

Everything you need is already inside you. Bringing forth your inner gifts, insights, and power leads to transformation. Ignoring your inner resources results in stagnation and emptiness.

Saying 71

Jesus said, "I shall destroy this house, and no one will be able to build it [...]."

Interpretation:

Let go of old structures and limiting beliefs in your life. Sometimes, spiritual growth requires letting your old identity dissolve so that something new and more authentic can emerge.

Saying 72

A man said to him, "Tell my brothers to divide my father's possessions with me." He said to him, "O man, who has made me a divider?" He turned to his disciples and said to them, "I am not a divider, am I?"

Interpretation:

Spiritual truth is about unity, not division. Don't get lost in arguments over material things—focus on harmony and higher values rather than external disputes.

Saying 73

Jesus said, "The harvest is great but the laborers are few. Beseech the Lord, therefore, to send out laborers to the harvest."

Interpretation:

There is vast potential for awakening and positive change in the world, but few people are willing to do the inner work. Become a conscious "laborer" and play your part in uplifting yourself and others.

Saying 74

He said, "O Lord, there are many around the drinking trough, but there is nothing in the cistern."

Interpretation:

Many people seek truth or fulfillment, but few find real substance. Look deeper than appearances—seek genuine spiritual nourishment, not just surface experiences.

Saying 75

Jesus said, "Many are standing at the door, but it is the solitary who will enter the bridal chamber."

Interpretation:

True spiritual union (awakening) is found within. Many search outside themselves, but only those who journey inward—willing to be alone and honest—enter the deepest mysteries.

Saying 76

Jesus said, "The kingdom of the father is like a merchant who had a consignment of merchandise and who discovered a pearl. That merchant was shrewd. He sold the merchandise and bought the pearl alone for himself. You too, seek his unfailing and enduring treasure where no moth comes near to devour and no worm destroys."

Interpretation:

True spiritual wisdom is more valuable than any material possession. Be willing to let go of lesser pursuits in order to claim the unique treasure of inner awakening and lasting fulfillment.

Saying 77

Jesus said, "It is I who am the light which is above them all. It is I who am the all. From me did the all come forth, and unto me did the all extend. Split a piece of wood, and I am there. Lift up the stone, and you will find me there."

Interpretation:

Divine consciousness is present in everything—within you and all creation. The sacred is found everywhere, not just in special places or people. Recognize the light within all things and within yourself.

Saying 78

Jesus said, "Why have you come out into the desert? To see a reed shaken by the wind? And to see a man clothed in fine garments like your kings and your great men? Upon them are the fine garments, and they are unable to discern the truth."

Interpretation:

Don't be distracted by appearances, wealth, or status. Truth is not found in outer displays, but in inner authenticity and clarity. Seek depth, not just what impresses the senses.

Saying 79

A woman from the crowd said to him, "Blessed are the womb which bore you and the breasts which nourished you." He said to her, "Blessed are those who have heard the word of the father and have truly kept it. For there will be days when you will say, 'Blessed are the womb which has not conceived and the breasts which have not given milk.'"

Interpretation:

Spiritual connection is deeper than physical lineage or tradition. It's not just about origins or appearances, but about living truthfully and aligning with higher wisdom in your daily life.

Saying 80

Jesus said, "He who has recognized the world has found the body, but he who has found the body is superior to the world."

Interpretation:

Understanding the illusions of the outer world helps you reconnect with your true self. When you discover your spiritual “body” or essence, you transcend worldly limitations.

Saying 81

Jesus said, "Let him who has grown rich be king, and let him who possesses power renounce it."

Interpretation:

Those who have achieved success are called to use their gifts wisely, with humility. True power is letting go of ego and embracing service to others and to a higher good.

Saying 82

Jesus said, "He who is near me is near the fire, and he who is far from me is far from the kingdom."

Interpretation:

Spiritual awakening can feel intense and challenging, but staying close to this inner “fire” leads to transformation and realization. Distance from your spiritual core leaves you feeling lost and disconnected.

Saying 83

Jesus said, "The images are manifest to man, but the light in them remains concealed in the image of the light of the father. He will become manifest, but his image will remain concealed by his light."

Interpretation:

Outer reality is just a reflection—look beyond appearances to see the hidden spiritual light within all things. As your consciousness grows, you recognize the deeper essence behind every image.

Saying 84

Saying 86

Jesus said, "The foxes have their holes and the birds have their nests, but the son of man has no place to lay his head and rest."

Interpretation:

The true seeker finds home not in a fixed place, but in the present moment and in spiritual awareness. Don't look for security only in external things; cultivate inner peace wherever you are.

Saying 87

Jesus said, "Wretched is the body that is dependant upon a body, and wretched is the soul that is dependent on these two."

Saying 89

Jesus said, "Why do you wash the outside of the cup? Do you not realize that he who made the inside is the same one who made the outside?"

Interpretation:

Focus on inner transformation, not just outward appearances. True change comes from cleansing your thoughts, beliefs, and intentions—the outer will follow the inner.

Saying 90

Jesus said, "Come unto me, for my yoke is easy and my lordship is mild, and you will find repose for yourselves."

Interpretation:

Living in alignment with spiritual truth brings peace and ease, not burden. Let go of struggle and embrace the gentle guidance of your higher self; life will become lighter.

Saying 91

They said to him, "Tell us who you are so that we may believe in you." He said to them, "You read the face of the sky and of the earth, but you have not recognized the one who is before you, and you do not know how to read this moment."

Saying 95

Jesus said, "If you have money, do not lend it at interest, but give it to one from whom you will not get it back."

Interpretation:

Give freely, without expecting anything in return. True abundance comes from generosity and trust, not from clinging or trying to control outcomes.

Saying 96

Jesus said, "The kingdom of the father is like a certain woman. She took a little leaven, concealed it in some dough, and made it into large loaves. Let him who has ears hear."

Interpretation:

A small spark of spiritual awareness can transform your entire life, just as a little yeast expands the dough. Even tiny positive changes, when nurtured, have the power to create profound transformation.

Saying 97

Jesus said, "The kingdom of the father is like a certain woman who was carrying a jar full of meal. While she was walking on the road, still some distance from home, the handle of the jar broke and the meal emptied out behind her on the road. She did not realize it; she had noticed no accident. When she reached her house, she set the jar down and found it empty."

Interpretation:

Sometimes, we lose spiritual awareness through inattention or distraction. Stay present and mindful so you don't lose what is truly valuable on your journey through life.

Saying 98

Jesus said, "The kingdom of the father is like a certain man who wanted to kill a powerful man. In his own house he drew his sword and stuck it into the wall in order to find out whether his hand could carry through. Then he slew the powerful man."

Interpretation:

Preparation and inner practice make transformation possible. Before you can overcome the greatest obstacles (even within yourself), first develop strength and clarity in your own "house"—your mind and soul.

Saying 99

The disciples said to him, "Your brothers and your mother are standing outside." He said to them, "Those here who do the will of my father are my brothers and my mother. It is they who will enter the kingdom of my father."

Interpretation:

Spiritual connection transcends blood ties and tradition. True family is found in those who share your values and inner purpose—spiritual kinship is about resonance, not just ancestry.

Saying 100

They showed Jesus a gold coin and said to him, "Caesar's men demand taxes from us." He said to them, "Give Caesar what belongs to Caesar, give God what belongs to God, and give me what is mine."

Interpretation:

Respect worldly systems when necessary, but never confuse material obligations with spiritual truth. Give your true loyalty to the divine within you, and keep your priorities clear.

Saying 101

Jesus said, "Whoever does not hate his father and his mother as I do cannot become a disciple to me. And whoever does not love his father and his mother as I do cannot become a disciple to me. For my mother [...], but my true mother gave me life."

Interpretation:

Interpretation:

Let your spiritual practice be authentic and spontaneous, not just ritual or obligation. There is a time for inner celebration and a time for discipline—let your intuition guide you.

Saying 105

Jesus said, "He who knows the father and the mother will be called the son of a harlot."

Interpretation:

Jesus said, "The kingdom is like a shepherd who had a hundred sheep. One of them, the largest, went astray. He left the ninety-nine sheep and looked for that one until he found it. When he had gone to such trouble, he said to the sheep, 'I care for you more than the ninety-nine.'"

Interpretation:

Your journey is unique and valued, even when you feel lost or different. The universe supports your return to spiritual wholeness, and your personal awakening is as important as that of the collective.

Saying 108

Jesus said, "He who will drink from my mouth will become like me. I myself shall become he, and the things that are hidden will be revealed to him."

Interpretation:

When you deeply absorb spiritual truth, you become one with it. As you internalize higher wisdom, hidden insights and abilities will naturally arise from within.

Saying 109

Interpretation:

Often, your greatest treasure is already within you, waiting to be discovered. Don't overlook your inner gifts or sell yourself short—realize your hidden potential and put it to use.

Saying 110

Jesus said, "Whoever finds the world and becomes rich, let him renounce the world."

Interpretation:

Material success is fleeting if you remain attached to it. True freedom comes when you can let go of worldly attachments and return to your spiritual core.

Saying 111

Jesus said, "The heavens and the earth will be rolled up in your presence. And the one who lives from the living one will not see death." Does not Jesus say, "Whoever finds himself is superior to the world?"

Interpretation:

Awakening to your true self is the ultimate liberation. When you live from your highest consciousness, you transcend fear, limitation, and even the idea of death.

Saying 112

Jesus said, "Woe to the flesh that depends on the soul; woe to the soul that depends on the flesh."

Interpretation:

Imbalance brings suffering—don't let your body rule your spirit, nor your spirit neglect the body. Harmony between your spiritual and physical life brings health and wholeness.

Saying 113

His disciples said to him, "When will the kingdom come?" Jesus said, "It will not come by waiting for it. It will not be a matter of saying 'here it is' or 'there it is.' Rather, the kingdom of the father is spread out upon the earth, and men do not see it."

Interpretation:

Heaven is not a far-off place or future event—it is a state of consciousness available here and now. Practice seeing the sacred in everyday life, and you will discover the "kingdom" all around you.

Saying 114

Simon Peter said to him, "Let Mary leave us, for women are not worthy of life." Jesus said, "I myself shall lead her in order to make her male, so that she too may become a living spirit resembling you males. For every woman who will make herself male will enter the kingdom of heaven."

Interpretation:

Spiritual awakening is about transcending dualities and social roles—masculine and feminine, inner and outer. The true “kingdom” is open to all who unite these aspects within themselves, rising beyond labels and limitations.
